Why Clean Your Air Ducts?

Your air handler and duct work, just like everything in your home, over time, gets dirty and needs to be cleaned. Even with a high-efficiency filter, air duct cleaning will eventually need to be done. The process greatly varies from company to company. Some air conditioning companies only clean the duct work and grilles; others only clean the return side of the duct work system. According to the National Air Duct Cleaners Association (NADCA), all internal components of the air handler, supply ducts, return duct, branch lines and all grilles should be hygienically cleaned by a certified HVAC contractor when an air duct cleaning is performed.

It's Important to Your Health

A dirty air handler and duct work can result in poor indoor air quality, debris coming from your supply vents, a dusty environment, high utility bills, and a decrease in the life of your equipment. In certain cases, microbial or "mold" contamination within the air handler and duct work has been linked to respiratory difficulties, allergies, headaches and skin rashes. An air duct cleaning could greatly help prevent these things.

Along with many other benefits, air duct cleaning can reduce equipment power consumption, dust and allergies in the home, and increase the life of the equipment.

What Causes Dirty Ducts?

Your air handler and duct work can become dirty or full of irritating allergens in as little as one season of normal use. A/C filters also can be very dense and make it hard for air to pass through their core. When air flow is reduced through the air handler's coil, condensation issues arise. Tiny airborne dirt particles then land in the condensation, forming food for microbial or "mold" activity. After a season or two of operation, microbial activity can grow down the duct work resulting in poor indoor air quality, flu-like symptoms, and unsightly looking vents.



How Will I Know It's Time?

Do you notice dust around your heating and air conditioning vents? Does your finger collect dirt as you wipe it across your furniture?

Do you have headaches, sinus problems, eye irritation, runny nose, coughing, dizziness, shortness of breath, nausea, tightness in the chest and upper respiratory distress?

All of these situations are telltale signs of contaminated air spread by dirty HVAC systems.

Our Process

When it comes to fighting dirty indoor air, **Envirovac** has what it takes to help residents breathe easier and feel better in their home. All our technicians are fully trained and equipped with the proper tools, cleaning agents and techniques to return your home to a healthier, more comfortable clean-air environment. Our experts will get the job done with this three-step process, and minimal disruption to your home and work schedules.

STEP 1: Inspect Your HVAC System

Our certified inspector opens your air handler and inspects the internal components for possible microbial growth. He or she will then access the interior of the duct work and inspect for contamination and possible microbial growth. You'll be provided with a written explanation of the findings and a step-by-step explanation of the cleaning process, along with the complete price for the service. This takes approximately 30 to 60 minutes and is FREE of charge!

STEP 2: Schedule the Air Duct Cleaning

Schedule your air duct cleaning. Our Envirovac team is available Monday through Friday, 7am to 5pm, to schedule your appointment.

STEP 3: Perform the Air Duct Cleaning

Our Envirovac technicians will use a microbiocide to clean and sanitize the air handler unit and duct work, including the coil, drain line and pan, blower wheel, and housing. We also take down, clean and sanitize each of your vent coverings. To clean the duct work, we open up your air handler and disassemble the blower wheel (which blows the air through your duct work). We then attach a 2,500-cubic-feet-per-minute HEPA-filtration vacuum unit in place of the blower wheel. This maintains negative pressure on your entire duct work system while we send hoses down each branch line, and main trunk line using 200-psi compressed air. This loosens up the dirt and debris which is then sucked back into the HEPA unit. The process will not make a mess in your home — our HEPA unit captures all the contaminants, creating a clean-air environment and reduction in allergy-causing pollutants.
